#### **SOCIAL EVENTS**

It was felt that the Winter Series visits to local pubs would still be too difficult to plan so **A Winter Walk is being organised on Saturday 22**<sup>nd</sup> **January** more details will follow nearer the time regarding location and start time.

It has been such a difficult year for Jane Bassett to get us all together, but we have had a couple of opportunities to catch up latterly. In August Jane and Alistair invited us to take afternoon tea in their lovely garden. 35 of us pitched up with picnic baskets brimming full with delicious food and drink, it was a beautiful afternoon.

The last event of the season was a Fish Supper which was held at the Blakeney Harbour Room. This was attended by 30 members who enjoyed the hearty two-course meal and another opportunity to get together. The supper was followed by an RNLI quiz won by the Fish out of Water team, the presentation of the remaining racing trophies for the season and the 50/50 draw. We collected £115 in donations for the RNLI.

#### **RACING**

We have had great support for Club racing this year as well as for the Morston and Blakeney Regattas. Blakeney Regatta broke with tradition and finished at Lapwing rather than down the Cut, firstly to encourage boats from Morston and secondly with regard to the number of people in the water at the traditional finish line. The change seems to have been well received and will be reviewed next year.

We were fortunate to have John Myers as Race Officer for Club Races and he encouraged members to get experience setting the course and running races with him from Lapwing.

A successful Open Meeting was held in September when we welcomed 13 Seaflys and 7 International 14s. They are two groups of dinghy sailors who love coming to Blakeney again and again and this year we were able to offer them fantastic sailing conditions – Blakeney at its best.

Andrew also ran a Laser/Single Hander training event in July attended by 9 members with concentration on starting. This included an on-shore briefing focusing on starting techniques, signals etc. and practice starts afloat. In addition, an informal Race Rules talk was held on the Carsner during MWHS.

#### **LAPWING**

The Committee had become increasingly concerned about Lapwing's condition over the last couple of years and after taking her out of the water in October it became clear that repair would be very costly and time-consuming.

It was decided to look for a replacement and last weekend a Romany 21 was delivered from Essex. There are many advantages including being able to get her out of the water and move her ourselves which will mean winter maintenance is much easier and cheaper. She is completely fibreglass which will also drastically reduce the maintenance.
